The Texas Baptist Men, Cuba research are designated serving in Cuban ministries since 1999. They are designated bence exempt from license for

by US Department of Commerce as eligible donors and hence exempt from license for many items that they ship to Cuba, including food items. They are approved by the Cuban government for these shipments of food, humanitarian goods, and disaster relief items.

Their primary objective is to equip missionaries and pastors as they share the gospel.

The house church movement in Cuba is exploding; there is a need for resources, including food.

The soup was distributed to and children's ministries on the Isle of Youth. Additionally, the students at the main campus of the Havana Baptist Theological Seminary, as well as seven extension locations, are meeting the needs of over 700 students. The Baptist Nursing *Home*, located in the southeastern part of



Havana, fed its residents, as well as elderly in their neighborhood. Soup was also taken to central Cuba to help many residents devastated by the floods during Hurricane Sandy. An

estimated 100 infants, 2,000 children aged 2-18, 5,000 adults and 200 seniors were provided with nutritious food.

This was the first ever *Gleanings For The Hungry* soup container to be received in Cuba, and the response was outstanding. It is very versatile and is used in

combination with other foods.

God is opening so many doors for Feeding The Nations, and because of partners like Texas Baptist Men and Gleanings For The Hungry, FTN can do so much more for the kingdom of God. A young pastor in a small sugarcane farming community in central Cuba



expressed his gratitude for the soup and told how he was able to share with another pastor in a nearby community. He spoke of mothers in his community who have the sole responsibility of providing for their children, due to fatherless families. He is thankful for the caring and sharing shown this community.

### **CAMBODIA**

"All farmers are gamblers, maybe that is a vital component for "People of faith"? We are working hard to make FCOP self-sufficient through rice production. The problem is we are either facing drought or flood, with a few good months in the middle. Since our crop failure last year we've been living mostly off of the good will of several donors, including *Gleanings for the Hungry*. The kids are well fed and the products have saved us.

Certainly, this past year has been difficult but ultimately, will be better off, as we develop safeguards against disaster. Right now we are thankful for our friends!"
