Since we worked in the soup plant sporadically in the summer, in addition to the normal fall/spring season, we have been able to produce and provide 34 million Statistics

servings of dry soup mix for those in need.

During the peach season, approximately 350 thousand pounds of dry fruit were processed and shipped.

552 quilts were created here at **Gleanings**, in addition to 112 quilts given by others. 446 of the quilts have gone to Israel.

255 containers were shipped through Gleanings; this includes our dry fruit and soup mix as well as donated product.

Gleanings For The Hungry partnered with Hope for New Life to provide food and hope to hundreds of orphans and the less fortunate facing hunger in Uganda.

Distribution of food took place throughout Uganda, including Pabbo, Kigumba, Adjumani, Kamengo, Mpigi, and Mizinro. A large extent of the distribution occurred at Kinships Centers, where distribution points could be set up at existing buildings. Food was also provided directly through home-based care, church kitchens, or given to communities in bulk.

Hope for New Life's evangelistic team also took time to hand out food sacks to families and children, those who had not previously been reached by the church. As a result, a feeding program has been established for low-income families.

## **Peter's Story**

Peter's dream is to become a doctor, but his dream seemed to fall to pieces when his parents died. At 11 years of age, Peter had to go to work collecting water for people. The money he was given in return was again handed off to his grandmother to buy them food.

Despite this arrangement, Peter was always hungry and had no one to look out for him as he worked. His life became too difficult for him to stand; he eventually resorted to sleeping in bushes and eating from garbage dumps with other homeless children.

Eventually, he came across some children from *Hope for New Life's* Kinship Center in Kyengera and saw how they were happy. Ruth Nakamya, a caregiver, noticed Peter and invited him to share their food.

Now Peter is a happy, healthy boy eating three meals a day. "I feel good here because I have enough food." Peter said. "Before I came to this Kinship Center, I did not know who Jesus was, but I met Him here."



## DIRECTOR'S CORNER

We are excited to start this year with enthusiasm, and a team of motivated volunteers. In January we always have several mission builders, mostly snowbirds from up north, who stay with us anywhere from one to three months. Our main focus this season is producing the soup and working on maintenance in the fruit plant. Desiring to improve the ability to clean the peach plant area, we are working on pouring a new floor that will cover all the uneven places and cracks.

A group of 22 people will be serving in Haiti for nine days with the Mission of Grace ministry. Eight of our staff will be part of the team, which will give them an opportunity to distribute food and love on people in need.
