Honduras

In 2013 **Children's Hunger Fund** launched a new **Mercy Network** in Honduras. Poor families in Honduras find themselves not only struggling to find work but to survive, as Honduras has the highest murder rate of any country in the world. Entire villages of families and children struggle to survive on the only homeland they've ever known. Lacking basic services like sewage and clean water, children grow up under extremely unhealthy conditions. **CHF's** (**Children's Hunger Fund**) newest **Mercy Network** delivers food and hope to the children living here.

We've partnered with Churches across the country to deliver the hope of the Gospel while at the same time meeting physical needs. Our food paks are fortified with dried fruit shared with us by our partners at **Gleanings for the Hungry**.

When our container arrived in 2013 pastors were eager to share with families who were broken. Here is a picture of the very first family served in Honduras by **Gleanings for the Hungry** and **Children's Hunger Fund**.

This family lives in a home that is comprised of wood planks and tarps. Their only income is derived from items taken from that dump that are either sold or recycled. With the food pak, the local church has the opportunity to not only meet some physical needs but build a relationship to share the gospel! All of our food paks in Honduras are assembled using the dried fruit given to us by **Gleanings for the Hungry**. Nearly 4,000 food paks have been delivered to our partners in country last year and each one has 2 1lb bags of fruit. As in other Latin American countries, it is received very well!
