FOOD REPORT: "SOPA DE DIOS" IN COLOMBIA

Two shipping containers filled with *Gleanings for the Hungry* soup mix arrived at Colombian shipping port, Buenaventura, on May 2, 2021. That same week, massive public demonstrations began in several major cities throughout Colombia. Large groups of demonstrators caused disturbances at the port, preventing trucks from unloading shipping containers.

Our Colombian ministry partners *Pueblo De Dios Pueblo De* Todos were able to retrieve the containers and move them to the first distribution site in the capitol city of Bogotá. Finally, the loads of *Gleanings* soup mix reached strategic distribution centers in Palmira, Bogotá, Cucuta, and Guajira. Networks of churches and Christian ministries picked up allotments of soup mix from the central storage point.

Since 2016, millions of Venezuelan migrants have flooded into Colombia to find relief from the catastrophic economic collapse of their country. According to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees:

"People continue to leave Venezuela to escape violence, insecurity and threats as well as lack of food, medicine and essential services. With over 5 million Venezuelans now living abroad, the vast majority in countries within Latin America and the Caribbean, this has become one of the largest displacement crises in the world."

Thousands of Venezuelan migrants have settled into small makeshift shelters in a slum-like city called Soacha on the rolling hills outside of Bogotá. Several churches in Bogotá and Soacha are working together to visit migrant families, pray for individuals, share scriptures, bring hot meals, and provide bags of soup mix for simple nutritious meals for the weeks ahead. The migrants are welcomed to small, nearby churches where they can receive help and love from the body of Christ. Praise the Lord for His body of believers in Colombia.

The Gleanings soup mix empowers Christians all over Colombia to reach out to desperate Venezuelan migrants and impoverished Colombians to provide food and the gospel of Jesus Christ. Join us as we continue to pray for our brothers and sisters in Colombia and Venezuela.
