Pive Gleaning's staff and three Empowerment Team leaders traveled to Managua, Nicaragua in May 2023. During the five-day tour, the team was able to visit various programs supported by Convoy of Hope: children's nutrition programs, women's empowerment facilities, early initiatives serving infants and mothers, and sustainable agriculture farms. A highlight of the trip was visiting the Convoy of Hope warehouse in Managua where pallets of Gleaning's soup mix and peach buckets are stored, ready to be given to various programs overseen by Convoy.



In a community called Ticuantepe, our group participated in a feria alimenticia, a food fair, showcasing different recipes for preparing *Gleaning's* soup mix and peaches. One of the popular items to taste was a cold, refreshing drink made from dried peaches. During the visit to the infant program, mothers and infants used *Gleaning's* food boxes with plastic balls to play an interactive game. The team was able to pray over these programs while they were there and build relationships with brothers and sisters in Christ.

On the last day of the trip, the team traveled outside of Managua to meet up with Kendra on the 40-acre property where *Feed the Hungry Nicaragua* is located. They helped pack 20 different pastors' vehicles with food. "We love to work with people who no one else is helping," Kendra said. "These pastors will take this food out to their churches and share Jesus with them." Feed the Hungry gives food to approximately 90,000 children in communities in the mountains, coasts and remote villages of Nicaragua. "We love giving oatmeal. Keep sending oatmeal!" she said. While the *Gleaning's* team was visiting, a truck arrived with a container of food that left California in February 2023. Director Fritz Meier and staff member Jesse Correll opened the doors of the container and began unloading pallets of food into the *Feed the Hungry* warehouse.



Both partnerships are dear to the heart of God. It was inspiring to see the mission of *Gleanings for the Hungry* carried out despite national challenges. The Kingdom of God is advancing in Nicaragua. Our God is good.
