

## COUNTRY REPORT: SÜI ESWATINI

For the first time in 11 years, *Heart for Africa's Project Canaan* is taking a pause on receiving more babies. "We have 16 babies under the age of six months," Janine said. "All 16 babies have RSV. We have one nurse, and we need two more nurses."



It is difficult to explain the needs of the children in eSwatini. More than half of the population are orphan children whose parents died of AIDS or other diseases. Many times, a young sibling is left to care for other young siblings. Young girls are forced to do unthinkable things for food, and they become pregnant at age 12 or 13. These children abandon their babies.

Project Canaan opened 11 years ago in order to take in abandoned babies and raise them to adulthood. Today they have over 350 children who receive excellent care, education, and skill training. Project Canaan, which has grown to include a ranch with vegetables, chickens for eggs, and cows for milk, also provides over four hundred jobs for community members.

"The kids really enjoy the oats from *Gleanings*," Janine said. "They are a big hit! The beans are great because they are so easy to cook. We have a new kitchen manager who is working on recipes for Swazis to enjoy the soup mix. They don't understand the concept of soup, so they use it as a sauce on bread."

Outside of *Project Canaan*, the ministry continues in churches across the country. "Your soup mix and donations make it possible for 4,500 kids to get food from church. Do you know what that means to them? They are learning about Jesus because Jesus is feeding them. Because Jesus feeds them, they don't have to have sex for food. I'm banking on this food speaking louder than the words of any pastor," Janine said.



How does the soup mix impact lives in eSwatini? "Your food is ministering to their heart and soul. Helping their emotional and social well-being. It's protecting and preventing teenage pregnancy." While the food is used for the children, staff, and local church ministries, *Heart for Africa* also delivers food to the entire country through welfare services. "We also support and provide food to welfare services, and they support the whole country," Janine said. "We can use as much food as could be sent. Half of the country is starving."

We need nurses.

We need a pastor.

We need to raise \$100,000 to finish building our primary school which will open January 2024.


Health of children. Good health for all of us.
