






Procurement Visits

This past June, *Gleanings* staff member, Eric McCallum, joined Ron Wagner on a 2-week procurement trip to Canada. Eric and Ron visited nearly 70 different farms to thank those who have donated peas and lentils to *Gleanings* and asked for others to donate. Many of these farms are Hutterite communities who live out their faith by functioning in closed communities and sharing all resources in common. "They are a very generous and hardworking people," said Eric after making countless visits to different Hutterite colonies. At each visit, both Ron and Eric would share about *Gleanings* and ask farmers to prayerfully consider donating a portion of their crops to the ministry. Many of the leaders had questions such

In addition to procuring more ingredients, the visits to the farms were focused on building personal connections with donors. Eric and Ron were able to see new projects being built in the farming communities and listen to different prayer needs. They attended house meetings and got to know individuals within the greater body of Christ. Will any of our Hutterite friends visit *Gleanings* in the future? The invitation was extended, and perhaps *Gleanings* will be able to return the favor of their hospitality someday.

Continue to Pray

While it's true that 80% of the peas and lentils used in *Gleanings* soup-mix come from Saskatchewan, the procurement process is all in God's hands. With each visit, we can only pray that God would move farmers to donate a portion of their pea and lentil harvest. Eric and Ron left each farm with the promise to call the farmers again in September to talk through the donation process. "It was a trip with many busy days, but we definitely saw God at work," said Eric. Please continue to pray that God would provide ingredients for His ministry and kingdom work through *Gleanings for the Hungry*.



NEW WAREHOUSE UPDATE

COUNTRY REPORT: GUATEMALA

HOPEOFTHENATIONS

"In his name the nations will put their hope,





Hope of the Nations Guatemala began eight years ago when Eric and Lisa Rivera, former staff members at Gleanings, heard a call from the Lord to feed the hungry people in Guatemala. They reconnected with Guatemalan pastor Billy Lemus, whom they met during their DTS outreach. Billy became the driver, translator, church planter, and visionary for the ministry, while Eric and Lisa took care of shipping, logistics, connections, and funding. Today, the ministry has grown to supply food to a network of 400+ churches, pastors, and some villages without pastors, who distribute food to people who are otherwise malnourished.

CHALLENGES - GETTING THE **FOOD WHERE IT IS NEEDED**

Six days a week, Eric and Billy deliver a truckload of boxes of food (Gleanings for the Hungry, Manna Pack, Lifeline, and groceries) to remote villages. "We go places nobody wants to go," Eric said. "And we are the first people who have ever gone there." Why doesn't anyone go to these villages to

help them? Billy said, "There are no roads. It takes two hours to go eight kilometers up a dirt hill. Sometimes we drive across lava rivers with sharp rocks. No one is going to these places. We are the only ones."

THE NEED FOR FOOD: PHYSICAL AND SPIRITUAL HUNGER

In El Dique, for example, there is so much hunger. "When we first got there," Eric said, "One of the boys was wetting the paper from books and eating paper to fill his stomach." Eric and Billy deliver food to El Dique regularly now that they know there is a need. They share the good news of Jesus Christ, teach people how to pray, and provide Bibles (although many people cannot read). "The food is a tool," Billy said. "But it is more than a tool. It is a key to open people's hearts."



THE HEART OF A MISSIONARY

As they bring food and build trust, Hope of the Nations learns about other needs within the community. This has led to small construction projects, trips to medical facilities, and help

with financial needs. We asked Eric, "What have you learned in the last eight years?" And he said, "My love for the people has grown. I used to just do this out of obedience. But I prayed, 'Lord, break my heart for what breaks yours.' And my heart was broken for these people. Out of obedience grew desire."

PRAYER REQUESTS & PRAISES:

In the community of Las Llaves, children who were once malnourished and on the list to be taken into the foster care system were able to gain weight and stay with their families thanks to the food God provided.

Also in Las Llaves, a single mother who was living with her children under a tarp is now living in a cinder block house with a roof, doors, and beds for her children.

Please pray for an increase of \$2,000 per month in funding for the ministry of *Hope of the Nations*. They need to pay for new tires and suspension work on their current vehicles, and they pray for a Land Cruiser to handle the rough terrain.

Please pray for Eric's health; and for Billy, whose wife passed away two years ago.
