The next school will run from September 14, 2025 – March 13, 2026, and it will be directed by staff members Bev and Eric McCallum.



Gleanings Soup Mix Goes to Hungry People

Feed the Hungry sends up to 50 containers of food to Nicaragua per year. **Gleanings** is one of several partnerships that makes it possible to run 1,000 feeding centers, feeding 103,000 children one meal per day.

The DTS Team was in Nicaragua from February 19 to March 8, 2025. "It was an honor to give out Gleanings soup mix in Nicaragua," said Eric McCallum, Gleanings staff member. "The fact that the team members had made soup mix and are now giving it out—that was amazing to them. The team could appreciate how much labor and love went into that soup. Each bag was special."

Visiting Garbage Dumps As part of their outreach

ministry, the DTS team visited two different garbage dumps. "We handed out food to all the people who came to us," Eric said. "We handed out soup mix and everyone received prayer. We did a devotional, a five-minute message, and prayed with them.

"The people in the dump are looking for cardboard, plastic bottles, and anything of value," Eric said. "These people are stuck there because it's all they know. To get out of this cycle, they would need vehicles and access to jobs. It's a spirit of poverty upon them."

Going Up the Mountain to Remote Villages

"We brought *Gleanings* 

soup mix and met up with a pastor who wanted us to share the gospel in a mountain community. The DTS team slept 'This soup mix is a gift on the floor from God. This is a gift of a church. of love from your brothers and the next and sisters in Christ." day we handed out soup mix. We spent the weekend there and visited door-to-door. inviting people to come to the meeting at the church every night. The soup is an

evangelism tool."

A Man's Answer to Prayer "In one of those mountain communities, we went into a house with soup mix and a Bible and offered prayer. There was a guy who had a tumor. We prayed for him. A week later, the man went to visit the pastor because the tumor was gone! He wanted to know who this God of healing was. The man prayed and accepted Christ into his heart."

### Day of Fun — Camp Day for Kids

Eighty kids from the dump community participated in a Fun Day for kids. Each of the DTS students brought 20 students through

the rotation of fun stations: Lego "We told them:

Building, Arts & Crafts, Petting Zoo, Swimming Pool, and Bible time. At the end of the day, each child went home with special gifts, including

multiple bags of Gleanings soup mix.
